Cookie Policy

Last updated: *May 2018*. This replaces all other earlier cookie policies.

British Association of Monaco ("BAM", "us", "we", or "our") uses cookies on, **www.bam-monaco.org** (the "Website")

By using the Website, you consent to the use of cookies.

Our Cookies Policy explains what cookies are, how we use cookies, how third-parties we may partner with may use cookies on the Website, your choices regarding cookies and further information about cookies.

What are cookies?

Cookies are small pieces of data sent by your web browser by a website you visit. A cookie file is stored in your web browser and allows the Website or a third-party to recognise you and make your next visit easier and the Website more useful to you.

Cookies can be "persistent" or "session" cookies.

How BAM uses cookies

When you use and access the Website, we may place a number of cookies files in your web browser.

We use cookies for the following purposes: to enable certain functions of the Website, to provide analytics and to store your preferences. At this time we do not display advertisements on the BAM web site so no cookies are used to enable advertisements delivery nor behavioural advertising.

We use both session and persistent cookies on the Website and we use different types of cookies to run the Website:

Essential cookies. We may use essential cookies to authenticate users and prevent fraudulent use of user accounts.

Anonymous analytics cookies. Every time someone visits our website, software provided by another organisation (Google Analytics) generates an 'Anonymous analytics cookie'. These cookies can tell us whether or not you have visited the site before.

Your browser will tell us if you have these cookies and, if you don't, we generate new ones. This allows us to track how many individual users we have, and how often they visit the site and where they visit on the website.

Unless you are signed into the Website, we cannot use these cookies to identify individuals. We use

them to gather statistics, for example, the number of visits to a page and the countries of origin of visits.

Note that at this time BAM members do not log on to the BAM web site so you cannot be identified as an individual by visiting the BAM website. If we restore BAM user logins then we will issue a new policy. For BAM administrators only: If you are logged in, we will also know the details you gave to us for this, such as your username and email address.

Third-party cookies. In addition to our own cookies, we may also use various third-parties cookies to report usage statistics of the Website and to track any emails that are sent to you by our bulk email service ("Mailchimp").

What are your choices regarding cookies?

If you'd like to delete cookies or instruct your web browser to delete or refuse cookies, please visit the help pages of your web browser.

Please note, however, that if you delete cookies or refuse to accept them, you might not be able to use all of the features we offer, you may not be able to store your preferences, and some of our pages might not display properly.
